ELIGIBILITY: High school seniors or college students enrolled in the freshmen or sophomore classes of undergraduate studies who are currently employed in the golf industry, or whose parents or grandparents are employed in or retired from the golf industry (PGA professionals, superintendents, sales representatives, club employees, or club managers, etc.). Applicants must be permanent residents of one of the following counties in south Florida; Broward, Charlotte, Collier, Dade, Hendry, Highlands, Glades, Indian River, Lee, Martin, Monroe, Palm Beach, Okeechobee and St. Lucie. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 200 hours of community service during their high school career, in addition to having maintained a 2.75 GPA. Application must include a letter of recommendation from a PGA professional or club manager. Students are not eligible to receive multiple SFPGA Charitable Foundation based scholarships during the same calendar year.

Only the award winners will be contacted, and results will be posted on our website.
